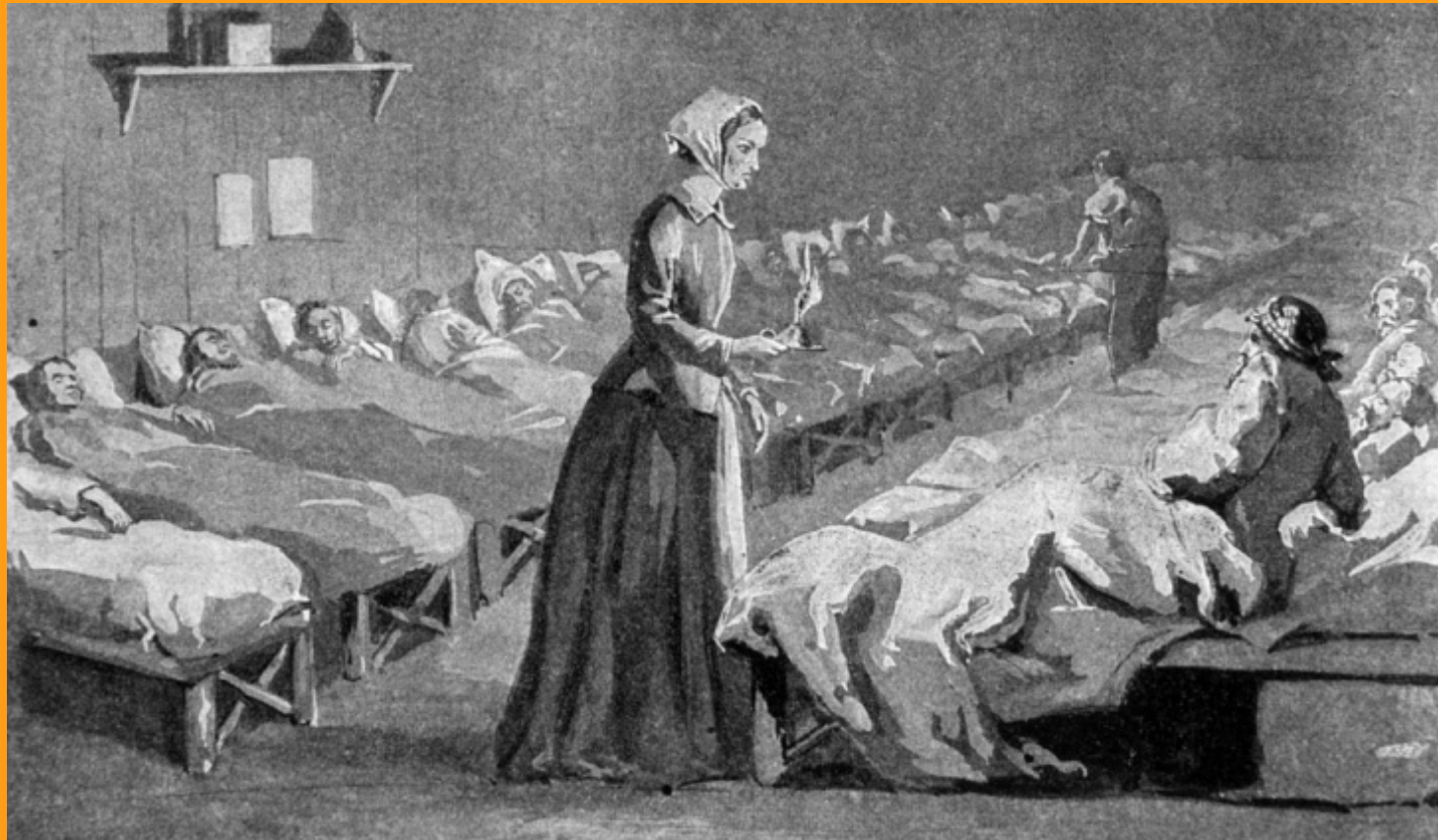
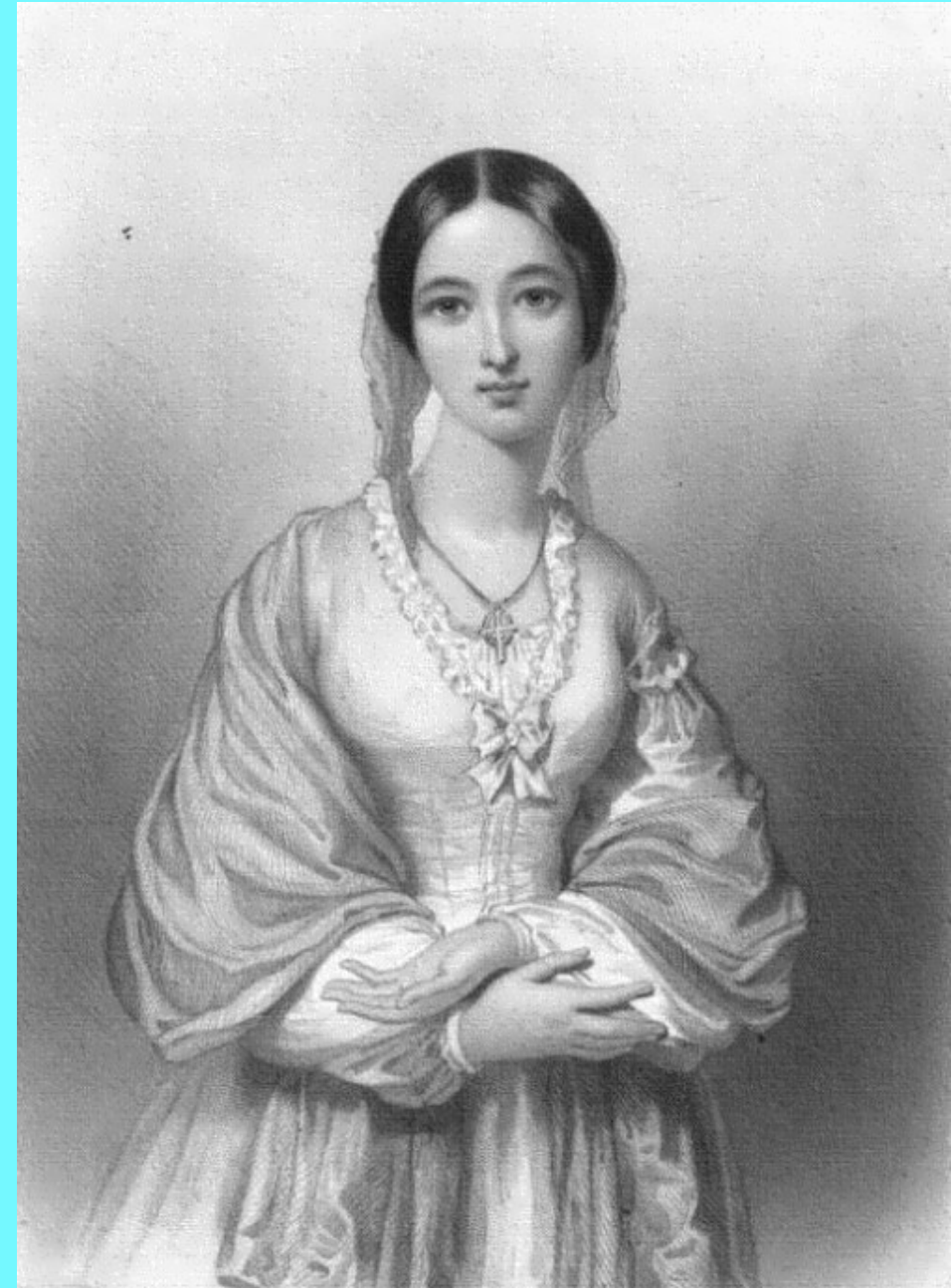


The life of Florence Nightingale by Alfie and Tanya

Florence Nightingale was born in 1820 with her parents and she was named after a city in Italy after where she was born. She had a big sister called Parthenope who was two year older than her.



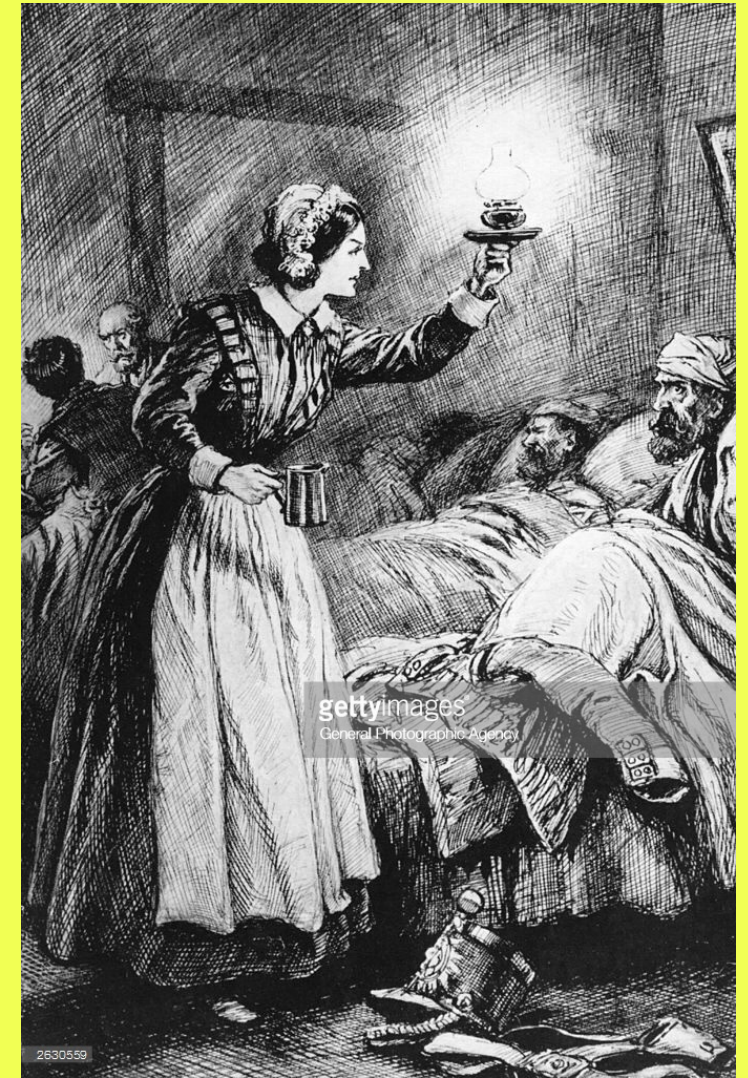
Growing Up

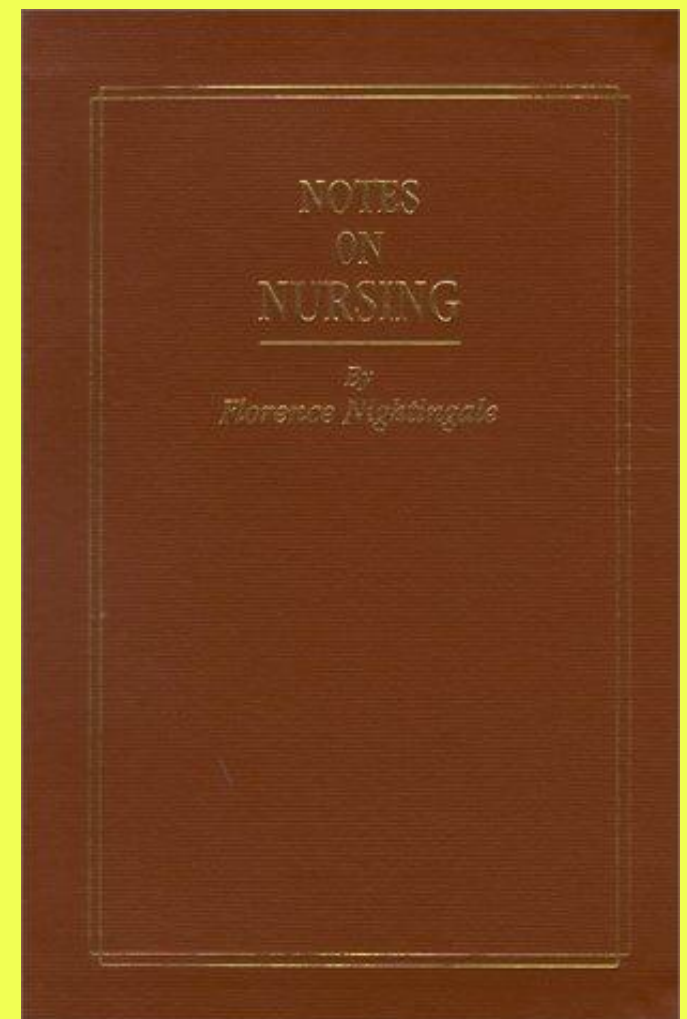


Did you know?

In 1907, Florence was awarded the Order of Merit. She was the first ever woman to be awarded this. In her old age, Florence wrote a book called Notes about Nursing. Every year on her birthday on the 12th May, we celebrate International Nurses Day.
